Beyond any single program, BGCSV has evolved into a dynamic force in youth development. We are deploying an unprecedented number of full-time staff members working alongside college and career counselors on-site in underserved high schools across the South Bay. Our team is now serving an astounding 2,500+ teens – a number that has increased dramatically in the last two years. Targeted programming is supported by peer mentoring and volunteers who draw out young people's inherent talents and abilities. Understanding the pivotal role of teen programming in achieving our mission, BGCSV is committed to scaling and increasing support for teenagers in their post-secondary journey.

College Bound

100% of eligible Club high schoolers graduated on time and are attending college.







College Readiness

The Club is committed to supporting students to and through college graduation. We offer innovative programs specially designed to provide caring, long-term, family-based college counseling that is attuned to the unique cultural characteristics of traditionally underserved and first-generation college students. Through our teen serving programs, we offer bilingual English/Spanish support, access to student and parent workshops, resources, networking opportunities, and peer mentoring.

The Club has expanded teen-focused initiatives promoting mental health and positive peer relationships, ensuring teens develop into well-rounded and emotionally resilient individuals. 
